Club Maintenance

Trees

As reported last month the work on the trees is due to <u>start on 10th October</u>. For obvious safety reasons there will be restrictions to access of the tennis courts and the garden area behind the Fisherman's Hut.

Male & Female Toilets - Mould Issues.

We are aware of problems with unlagged pipes behind the low level panelling causing condensation and subsequent mould issues at low level. At present Club funds are not sufficient to attend to this problem due to other major projects being under taken. We will address this issue in the near future.

Roof

Members will be well aware of the moss growing on the main roof of the club. We have had a report prepared on the state of the roof. The main structure appears to be sound by there are problems with the tiles.

Not so obvious is the condition of the flat roof over the bar and cellar behind, though the leaks last winter give a clue. As we reported in June, the flat roof covering is fifteen years old and is close to the end of it's life.

We have asked contractors for estimates to renew both rooves and we are please to have received two quotes.

Electricity

The cost of electricity has risen for all of us. The recent government price cap for domestic consumption does not apply to the club. Eon supply the electricity for the club and we await information on tariffs for business customers. In the meantime, since we have to renew the roof we are looking at the possibility of installing integrated solar panels. Doing so will reduce the number of tiles we need for the roof and provide some reduction in our electricity bills. Watch this space!
