

We hope to have a good turnout. It is very important for our bowls members to attend this meeting and show their support for the committee who work so hard throughout the year.


We are planning to hold a skittles evening at the RBL in early February so look out for more information later.

### **Club Maintenance**

### **Damp**

The source of the damp in the men's toilets has been identified. There culprit was the toilet cistern splashing each time the toilet was flushed. Andy Pullen has the retification in hand, including the replacement of the wooden panelling.

We can also report another damp problem has been resolved. Rain water has been getting under the emergence exit from the snooker room. By breaking up the concrete step outside the door and remaking the step substantially lower and with the correct fall away from the door the problem has been resolved. The heavy rain on Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> November really tested the fix which passed with flying colours.

#### Roof

We are working through the quotes for the work on the roof and the proposed solar panels. We have made a preliminary selection of contractors and are now bring them together to ensure they coordinate their work and eliminate duplication. For example, scaffolding has to be suitable to satisfy the access requirements of both teams.

#### **Trees**

News about the trees is covered in the tennis section. Thanks to the volunteers who helped clear up the courts after the contractors had left.

While the contractors were on site they identified a cooper beach tree that is unstable. This was only apparent after the ash trees nearby had been felled. Sadly the tree cannot be saved and will have to be felled. Paperwork has been raised to get permission from West Berks. Council.

# A Request to all members

Most members will be aware of a garden area behind the Bowls pavilion and the boundary with the canal towpath. In the past this has been used to grow flowers and vegetables.

In August a notice was put up in the garden area announcing the start date of the tree felling to alert anybody informally using the area that the area would be closed from 1<sup>st</sup> October.

With the ongoing tree maintenance work the area remains closed. The committee have not made a decision on the future use of the area and will be unable to do so until all work is complete.

Members are asked to not enter the area.
